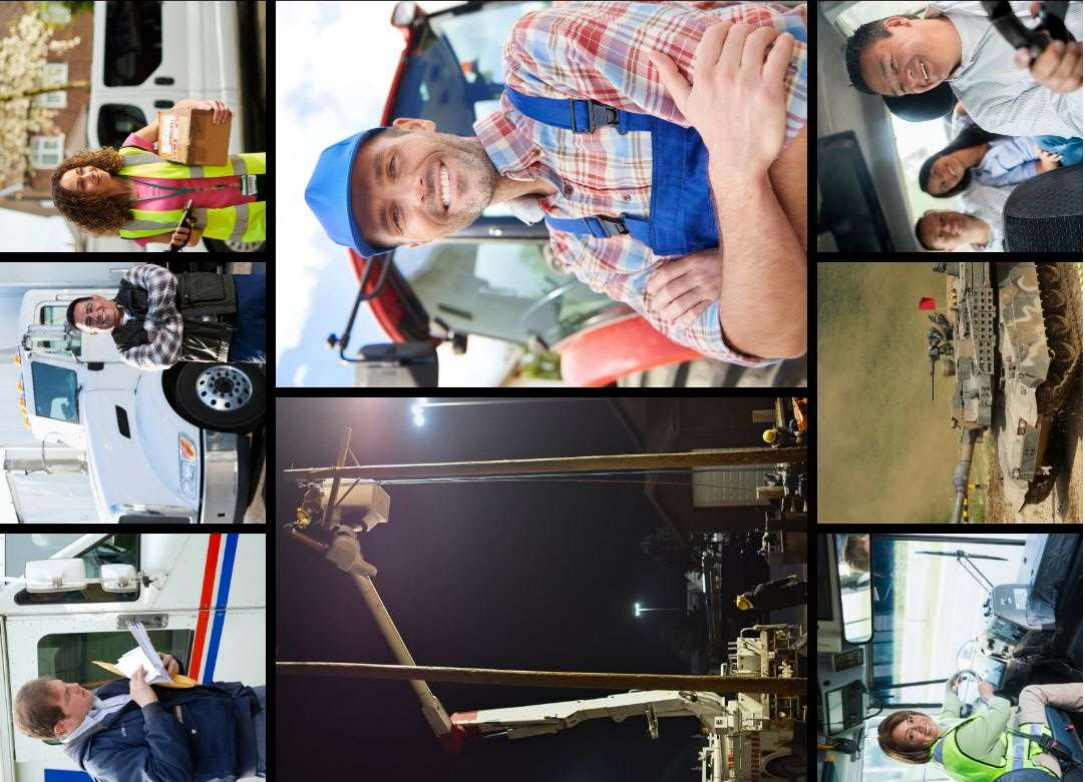

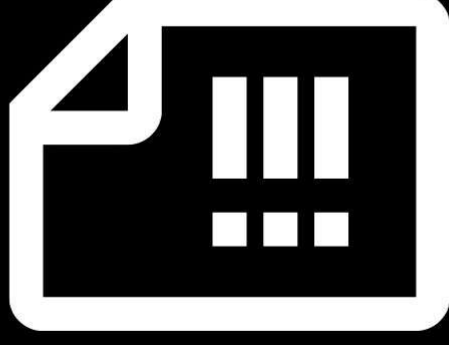

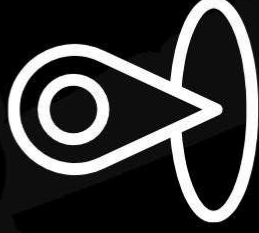
- Email Blast from the Principal

OPPORTUNITIES



Those with a Financial Need can qualify for Career Readiness Funds through the individual county's Job and Family Services. We work with both Pickaway and Ross counties.

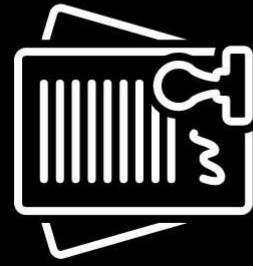
Currently, our local third-party vendor that offers Driver's Education is Capabilities.

WHAT A THIRD-PARTY VENDOR THROUGH ODD CAN DO

Ohio | Opportunities for Ohioans
with Disabilities

- Pre-Drivers Education - Tutoring to pass the Knowledge test for the temporary permit.
- Driving Assessment -trained and licensed driving instructor with the state and a disability endorsement.
- First Time Driver Course - Juvenile (Ohio Law requires 24 hours) or Adult (abbreviated). Many format available (face to face, online, and online self-paced)
- On-the-road Driving Instruction





LEGAL/LIABILITY ISSUES

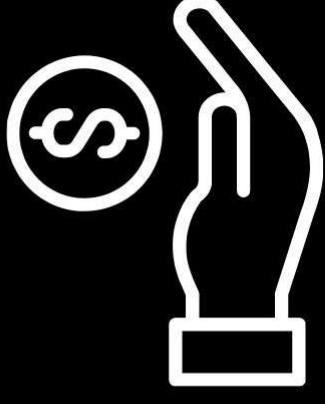


By contracting with the vendor, Team Driving, we are able to control these issues because the vendor has their own insurance and is licensed with the State of Ohio.

Some other things to consider:

- Staff of the Driver's School (BCI/FBI background checks)
- Location agreement
 - We have them at school and they allow students to make up classes at their center. This also addresses facility-use regulations.
- Timeline from start to finish
 - Driving can take a while
- Costs
- No guarantee of student enrollment
- Conditions that vendor will comply with applicable regulations
- Indemnity

Updating online Crash Scene Investigation Simulation involving high school students in measuring and data collection.
